## NIACC courses offered at HDHS

### Computers and Information Systems (3 s.h.)

Students learn how computers work and how to do word processing, electronic spreadsheets, data bases, and presentation software. They also learn file management and basic web page development.

### Beginning Web Page Development (3 s.h.)

On the computer, students learn how to make a web page, which can be seen on the Internet. Students learn how to add graphics, change colors, and use various fonts.



### Home/Office Computer Management (3 s.h.)

In this hands-on class, students learn how to connect computers and share files, how to bring pictures onto a computer, and how to create a computer network. They also learn how to install memory, upgrade Windows, and scan for viruses.

### Human Relations (3 s.h.)

Students learn how to get along with each other by understanding interpersonal skills at home and in business. Human Relations looks at what can be done to anticipate problems, resolve them, or prevent them from happening.

### Introduction to Teaching (3 s.h.)

An introductory course in teacher education that gives students a clear view of the skills and knowledge they will need to be successful professionals. Classroom observations provide practical experience.

### Composition & Speech I & II\* (Seniors only)

Students improve skills in reading, writing, speaking, and listening. Research methods are also a focus. (8 s.h.)

*\*These courses meet core General Education requirements at many colleges.*

### Introduction to Health Professions (2 s.h.)

This course covers a brief history of health care, as well as today's health care delivery system and health care issues. Students observe health care professionals and research careers.

### Medical Terminology I (3 s.h.)

Introduction to basic medical terminology utilizing a programmed, word-building system to learn word parts to construct and analyze new terms. Emphasis is placed on spelling, definition, usage, and pronunciation.

### Nurse Aide Theory & Clinical

This 75-hour nurse aide course is designed to meet the training requirements for aides working in nursing facilities. Emphasis is on students achieving a basic level of knowledge and demonstrating skills to provide safe, effective resident care. (3 s.h.) CNA course.

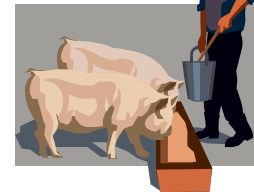


### Developmental Psychology\* (3 s.h.)

A study of the physical, mental, emotional, and social growth of the person from conception to adulthood.

### Animal Science I (3 s.h.)

This course provides a general overview of the livestock industry. Students will develop an understanding of and be able to apply the basic principles of animal selection, breeding, genetics, feeding, health, and husbandry practices.



### Principles of Agronomy

Topics covered include plant anatomy, physiology, classification and ID; pests; pesticides; and pest management. Students will take the Iowa Core Manual examination. (3 s.h.)



The following HDHS courses articulate for NIACC credit if the student receives a 'B' grade or higher: Accounting, Sports Nutrition, Electrical Concepts, and General Metals.
