As a partner with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's Energy Star program, NIACC commits to protecting the environment through energy efficiency and improving building energy efficiency by ten percent or more. This partnership strives to implement and promote energy efficiency improvements that lower energy costs and reduce the risks of global warming.

"As part of our work to move these new initiatives forward, we're forming a committee made up of faculty, staff, students and potentially community members to focus on our sustainability efforts," Tony Pappas, NIACC director of facilities management, said. "We are fully committed to minimizing our carbon footprint and continuing to do our part through energy efficiency."
