

American Rescue Plan Report

In compliance with the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund III (HEERF-III) requirements under the American Rescue Plan, North Iowa Area Community College acknowledges the certification and agreement form was signed and returned and that NIACC intends to use the funds to provide the mandated amount in emergency financial aid grants to be used by the college for COVID related expenses. NIACC will receive a total of \$2,248,117 under the HEERF III institutional portion. As of September 30, 2021, NIACC has used \$59,146.35 to purchase technology for computers and servers to provide better remote services to help with the increase of online learning to all students and faculty. We have also spent \$2,120.55 for hotspots available to any student who does not have reliable internet or no internet access at all. We have used \$13,153.54 for additional cleaning supplies, HEPA filters, and nursing supplies. To continue to develop our faculty members knowledge for online teaching, NIACC has provided them with professional development in the amount of \$39,578.40. NIACC has spent \$4,000 on mental health services to help students navigate this pandemic if they need someone to reach out to. NIACC has also contracted with a local medical provider to have nurses on campus in order to provide assistance to the students and staff who may be infected with the virus for a total of \$2,660 along with testing athletes. NIACC reimbursed the college \$20,697.42 for those employees who used the FFRCA due to exposure to COVID-19. Total lost revenue related to the decline in enrollment equaled \$124,644.00. This was computed for Summer 2021. We used the number of total credit hours record for Summer 2021 compared to the number of total credit hours record for Summer 2020. Total lost revenue for lost sales in our food court, rental spaces, and bookstore was \$179,915.46. These numbers was computed by using a three year average of sales. NIACC will use the remaining funds for lost revenue, PPE needs, technology needs, as well as additional student grants as needed.
