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

## Teacher Education Courses

### Introduction to Teaching

An introductory course in teacher education that gives students a clear view of the skills and knowledge they will need to be successful professionals. The course covers the place of the school in the community, basic philosophy including foundations and the future, the organization and administration of schools, and the nature of the curriculum.

### Field Experience and Seminar

The Introduction to Teaching field experience provides purposeful classroom observations for pre-service teachers. Students will reflect on the ways schools function, identify the roles and responsibilities of teachers, and observe student behavior. Evaluation is pass/no pass.

### Educational Technology and Design

The production and use of instructional media/computer technology and their relationship to educational strategies within an instructional design framework.

### Introduction to Psychology

An introduction to the scientific study of behavior; a brief history of psychology as a science, and topics fundamental to human behavior including developmental issues, sensory abilities, cognitive performance, social and emotional factors in behavior, and abnormal behavior and therapies.

### Child and Adolescent Psychology

This course covers information relevant to the development of humans from the prenatal stages through adolescence providing an introduction to and survey of behavioral characteristics of individual development. Intertwoven into each stage of development are the affects of community, family, and school in the development of children and adolescence.
