General Comments: North Iowa Area Community College offers training programs for those interested in becoming Certified Nursing Assistants. Courses are offered several times a year in a variety of locations and are taught by Registered Nurses. The course is designed to provide the knowledge and skills needed to care for patients/residents in a variety of long-term care facilities and in preparation of the Iowa Direct Care Worker registry exams. The first 55 hours of the course are held in a classroom/lab and the remaining 30 hours of clinical will be in a nursing home. You will give patient care under the supervision of your instructor. At the end of this course, you must take the Direct Care Worker registry written and skills exam to be eligible for employment in long-term care. Successful completion of these exams is required by State Legislation in order to work in a long-term care facility. Certification requires identification with a social security number and government-issued identification.

General Comments:

Students are eligible for the licensing exams upon successful completion of the EMS program. Successful completion of the licensing exams results in Iowa licensure and a National Registry of EMTs (NREMT) certification. NREMT certifications serve as the basis of reciprocity and must be renewed every two years to remain active. To gain licensure in other states, students must maintain their NREMT certification.

A limited number of states participate in the Recognition of EMS Personnel Licensure Interstate Compact (REPLICA) which extends a qualified EMS professional licensed in a "Home State" the "Privilege to Practice" in "Remote States" for qualified circumstances. REPLICA may allow a graduate with a lapsed NREMT certification to gain licensure in certain states without current NREMT status. Information regarding the EMS Compact and the Interstate Commission for EMS Personnel Practice is available at www.EMSCompact.gov.

Some states require an applicant for licensure, certification, or registration as an apprentice to be enrolled in an apprenticeship program registered with the U.S. Department of Labor upon application and other states substitute formal education for some of the experience hours required to complete an apprenticeship.</p>

General Comments: Upon successful completion of the Practical Nursing curriculum, the student is awarded a Diploma and is eligible for the NCLEX-PN exam. After passing this examination, the graduate receives licensed practical nurse status and is prepared to work in a beginning licensed practical nurse position under the supervision of qualified personnel. The program is approved by the Iowa Board of Nursing. An applicant that plans to license in another state is advised to contact the state board of nursing for specific licensure requirements. Assistance to obtain state licensure requirements is available upon request.

Individuals considering enrollment or currently enrolled in the nursing program should be aware that prior felony convictions may prohibit eligibility for licensure upon completion of the program.

Licensure application requires legal presence in the United States including a social security number, U.S. visa, or U.S. green card. English proficiency recommendations for the licensure exam are identified by the National Council of State Boards of Nursing.

Students should be aware they may need to travel a distance for clinical experience and that some clinical experiences will be scheduled during evening/night hours and weekends. Drug testing may be required by individual agencies. Criminal background checks and adult/dependent/child abuse checks will be required for all incoming students. Results of the background and abuse checks will be reviewed to determine eligibility for clinical enrollment in the program. Costs for requirements will be the responsibility of the student.
