



#### Fall Headcount












Campus View Housing Headcount








#### **Athletics Headcount**




#### Program Area Headcount












#### Program Area Enrollment by Sex






# **Geographic Distribution**







**Total Minority Enrollment Percentage** 





Total Minority by Race and Ethnicity





#### Average Age of Minority Students








#### Minority Enrollment by Meta Major






### Area 2


5-Year Market Share



Area 2 Market Share by High School





#### International Student Enrollment






#### International Countries Represented




# **Meta Major Enrollment**

#### Enrollment by Meta Major






#### Enrollment by Meta Major (without Concurrent Enrollment)



#### Enrollment by Sex in each Meta Major (Concurrent)




#### Enrollment by Sex in each Meta Major (Traditional/Adult)






## **Enrollment by Program Area**







## **Online Credit Hours**




## Online Head Count by Enrollment Type

## Penetration Rate: Credit & Non-Credit Enrollment










## Enrollment by Meta Major



## Average Credits Per Concurrent Student




## Concurrent Enrollment as a Percent of Total Enrollment







## Course Enrollment Grade Success – Percent Success





















Five-Year Post-Graduation Wages







## **Student Survey Results Spring 2025**

The 2025 Revealing Institutional Strengths and Challenges (RISC) Student Survey was conducted in the Spring of 2025. Results are compared to a national comparison group of 33 other colleges, including a sample of 15,674 student respondents.

## Success in Courses

To help uncover where students are facing challenges, the **major categories** of challenges are ranked in descending order, followed by ranking the specific challenges within each major category in descending order.


The most common subcategory was "online classes", with 27 percent choosing challenges in this subcategory. The most common specific challenge within the "online classes" subcategory was "difficulty learning the material on my own", with 14 percent of students mentioning this as a challenge to their success. ## Student Challenges

The figure below compares students surveyed at NIACC to those from the comparison group. NIACC students indicated that they had similar challenges to the comparison group. However, over half of student respondents identified challenges in the areas of success in courses (53%) and nearly half identified challenges with work and personal issues (48%).



## Paying for College & Living Expenses

Nearly one-fourth (21%) of NIACC students indicated that "tuition and fees" were their top challenge, followed by "living expenses (housing, food, healthcare)" at 17 percent, which was a smaller percentage than that of the comparison colleges. Notably, books, software, and other supplies were also a challenge for students, but the percentage of students facing this challenge was much lower than that of the comparison colleges (8% compared to 17%).

## Welcoming Campus Environment

Survey questions included students' experiences regarding their perception of whether the campus provides a welcoming environment and whether the college follows a student-first philosophy. Nearly all (86%) of students find NIACC campuses are very welcoming" or "somewhat welcoming".

Additionally, 96 percent of students are "somewhat likely" (27%) or "very likely" (69%) to recommend NIACC to other prospective students, which is higher than the benchmark comparison colleges, where 92 percent are "somewhat likely" (29%) or "very likely" (63%) to recommend.
