

What is the High School Equivalency (HSE) Program?

HSE prepares students to take the HiSET exam, lowa's approved high school equivalency assessment. The course will also focus on college and career readiness.

Who should attend?

Individuals seeking a high school diploma. Students must be 16 or older and not enrolled in high school.

How do I get started?

HSE classes typically run for eight weeks. To secure your spot, you must first take an assessment. On the first night of class, you will complete the required orientation. Contact the Adult Education program at (641) 422-4278 or AEL@niacc.edu to get started.

Students will be automatically enrolled in the next session until they complete their diploma.
